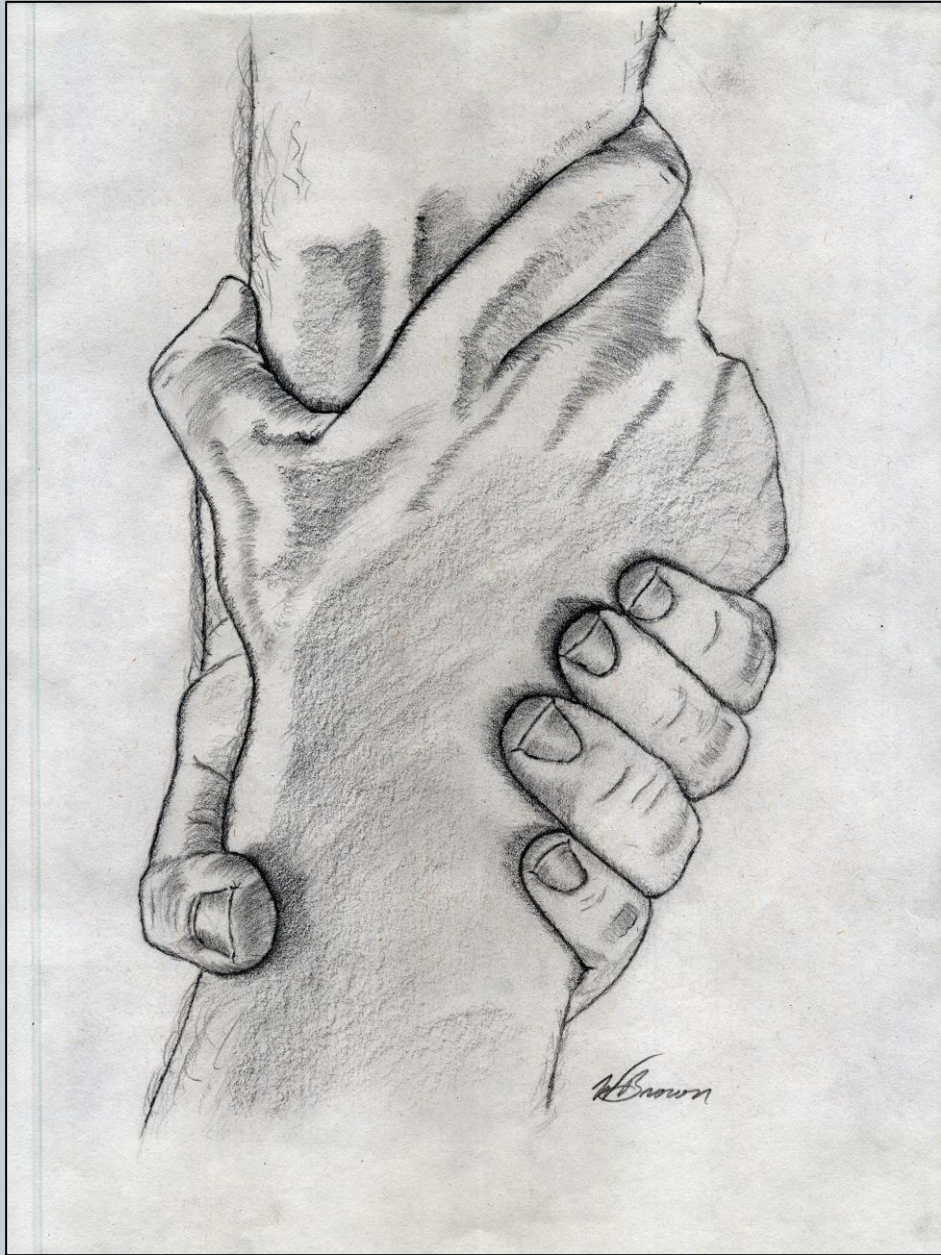
Weird Symmetry:
